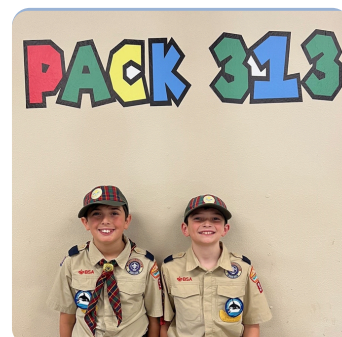
Scouting for Food History!

Popcorn Sales Success!

The 2024 popcorn season was marked by a historic achievement within our Council. While overall sales totaled over \$1.2 million! Unit 313 shattered records on a national scale by achieving an astounding \$300,000+ in popcorn sales! This achievement not only set a new standard within our Council but also established a national record for popcorn sales by a single unit. Unit 313's extraordinary accomplishment is a testament to their hard work, teamwork, and commitment to excellence.

2024 Membership Highlights



- **Cub Scouts:** The foundation of our movement saw growth this year as more families discovered the excitement of Cub Scouting events like Spook-O-Ree and Nova Academy.



- **Scouts BSA:** Membership in our core program flourished, with new troops established and hundreds of youth advancing through the ranks, including 227 Eagle Scouts.



- **Exploring/Venturing/Sea Scouts:** Career-oriented Exploring programs expanded into new schools and community organizations, offering youth hands-on opportunities in law enforcement, firefighting, healthcare, and more. Meanwhile, Venturing crews and Sea Scout ships provided older Scouts with high-adventure experiences, leadership training, and opportunities to explore their passions on land *and* water. Together, these programs continue to inspire growth, teamwork, and a spirit of exploration.

PROGRAM IMPACT

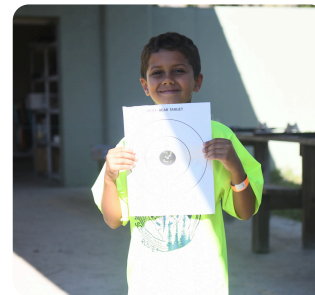
2024 was a remarkable year of growth for the Greater Tampa Bay Area Council as we welcomed new Scouts and families into the adventure of Scouting. Together, we strengthened our programs, expanded our reach, and ensured that more youth had access to the life-changing experiences Scouting offers.

A Year of Growth and Achievement in Our Camp and Training Programs!

This year, our camp and training programs provided Scouts and leaders with unparalleled opportunities to grow, learn, and succeed. In 2024, we proudly recorded over 36,600 camping nights, reflecting the vibrant participation of our Scouting community. More than half of our resident Scouts attended one of our flagship council-led camps, while 5,281 Scouts, families, and adult leaders took part in events like Splash-O-Ree, Spook-O-Ree, and our ever-popular Resident Camps. Scouts collectively earned an impressive 8,917 merit badges, mastering skills ranging from outdoor adventure to STEM and Citizenship in Society.

Leadership development remained at the forefront of our mission. Programs like Wood Badge and National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) prepared the next generation of leaders to guide with confidence and purpose. Additionally, essential training for adult leaders—through courses such as BALOO, IOLS, and IOLST—ensured they had the tools to lead and inspire. This year, a remarkable 292 Scouters completed a national training course within our council.

These transformative experiences fostered resilience, teamwork, and a commitment to service, creating lifelong memories and equipping our Scouts and leaders for the challenges ahead.

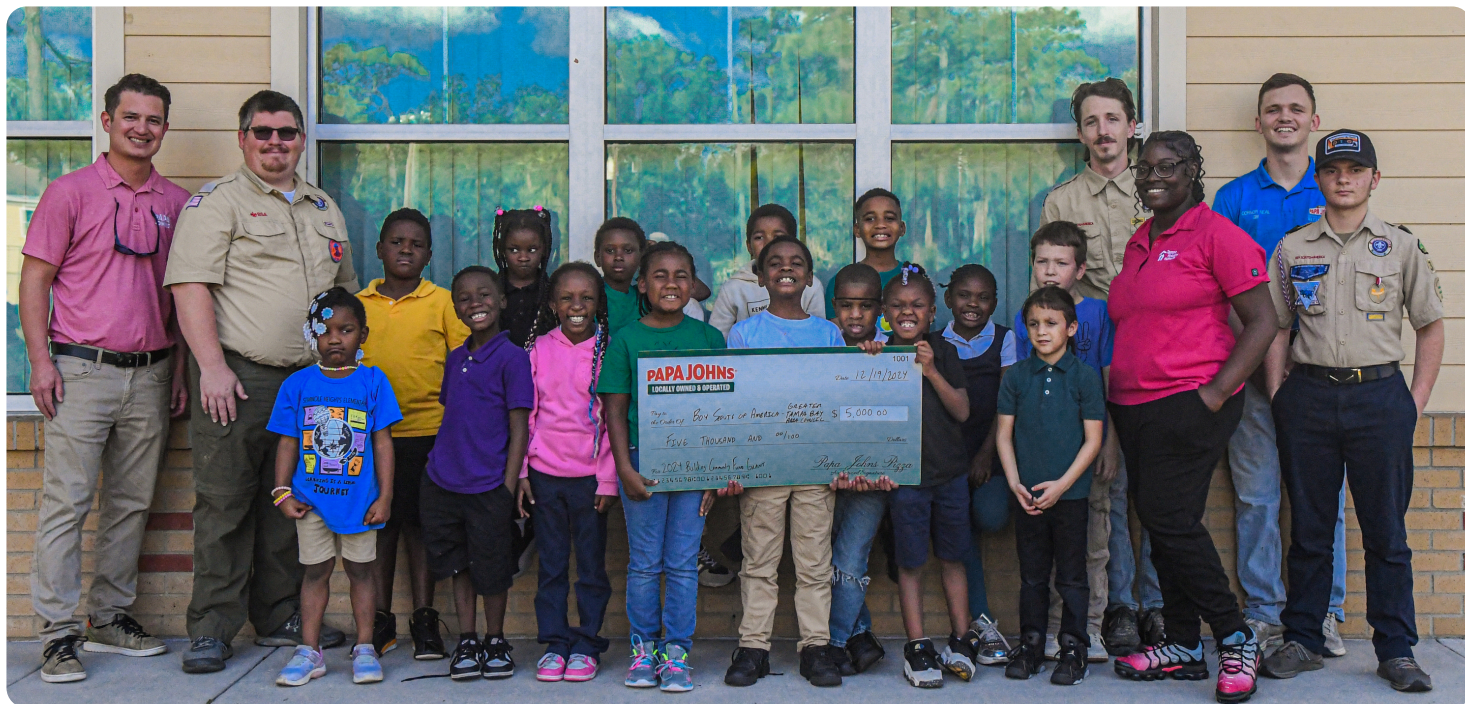
