Why are we changing our approach?

- Strong, active units ensure a great Scouting experience for youth and volunteers.
- Commissioners should help units by listening to the needs of unit leaders and serving as the single, best resource.
- Changing how we engage with unit leaders should result in stronger partnerships between unit leaders and commissioners.
- Current system of scoring and assessing was not consistent and did not help unit leaders.

What is changing?



Unit Metrics

- We are changing from subjective scoring to objective metrics which are readily available from Scouting America information systems.
- Metrics can help us determine which units <u>might</u> need help, what areas <u>might</u> need focus, and which commissioners might be the best fit to help them.
- Metrics are not a barrier to building relationships with unit leaders.
- Metrics are NOT intended to be a tool for us to use to tell unit leaders what they are doing wrong or point out where they don't succeed.
- Objective unit metrics include: Key Leaders Trained, Unit Size, Membership Growth, Advancement/Youth Leaders, Outdoor Activities, and Youth Retention.

Unit Connections

- Replacing Simple and Detailed Assessments.
- Unit Connections revolve around informed discussions which build relationships with units and their leaders.
- Connections help commissioners offer support that meets specific unit needs.
