A MESSAGE FROM THE SCOUT EXECUTIVE

In 2025, the Greater Tampa Bay Area Council reached new milestones in program delivery and service. Almost every program quality metric exceeded expectations. New youth recruited far surpassed prior year efforts, a near record 47 new Scouting units were organized, and 254 young men and women earned the Eagle Scout Award.

The Council continued to make significant investments in the camping facilities as new centralized bathhouses are under construction at Camp Soule, a new maintenance facility is nearing completion at Camp Brorein, and plans for the new Camp Brorein Dining Hall are progressing with an expected groundbreaking this year. More enhancements are scheduled in 2026 for all the camp properties.

Gaining community support through fundraising efforts, special events, and popcorn sales highlighted the value Scouting has among the Tampa Bay region. Generous financial support ensured that membership service and outreach programs could continue to expand serving nearly 13,000 young people throughout 2025.

More than 3,200 dedicated volunteers shared their time and talents with Scouting serving as role models and mentors to our young people. Hundreds of volunteers completed valuable training programs to insure that quality Scouting experiences result in long-lasting impact for our Scouts.

Under the leadership of Council President Benson Porter and the Executive Board, the Council made significant strides to invest in quality program initiatives and camping facilities while working to grow member participation. This commitment will continue in 2026.

The Greater Tampa Bay Area Council is consistently recognized as one of the top councils in America and as we look toward 2026, we have great enthusiasm to build on the foundation and successes of 2025 to serve more youth and families with exciting Scouting adventures in the years to come.

Thank you to all the volunteers, Council leadership, and staff for your dedicated efforts to keep Scouting strong in Tampa Bay!

When I sent a photo of my daughter and me in uniform to my brother's former leaders and received warm replies, something inside me stirred. They remembered us, and suddenly, I remembered a part of myself I thought I'd left behind.

Standing beside my daughter in her own Scouting journey, I realized that Scouting never truly left me—it simply waited for me to come home.

In 2025, ScoutReach continued to shine as one of our council's most impactful programs—opening doors, breaking barriers, and ensuring that every young person, regardless of circumstance, has the chance to experience the power of Scouting. Through strong community partnerships, dedicated volunteers, and focused support, ScoutReach provided thousands of youth with hands-on learning, character-building experiences, and meaningful mentorship that extends far beyond the meeting room.

This year also marked an incredible milestone for the program:

Our Annual Scouting Forward Breakfast raised over \$40,000, the highest total in its history. The generosity of attendees, sponsors, and community leaders not only fuels the growth of ScoutReach but directly supports the youth who rely on it the most—helping us deliver safe spaces, quality programming, and opportunities that build confidence and leadership.

TAMPA SCOUT TAKES ON ALL 142 MERIT BADGES

When Jacob from Troop 610 began Scouting, he wasn't chasing records—he was chasing experiences. What inspired him wasn't the number of badges available, but the chance to explore the world through each one.

“These merit badges give me real-life lessons and real jobs you can have,” he shared.

Now 17, Jacob has earned 120 of the 142 available badges, discovering new skills from whitewater rafting and fishing to citizenship and digital technology. Many of those experiences have grown into lifelong passions. “I go fishing every month now. Canoeing, kayaking, whitewater rafting—I do all of these because of Scouting.”

Jacob's dedication has become a source of inspiration within Troop 610. Younger Scouts often ask for advice, compare badge counts, and learn from his determination.

His Scoutmaster—and proud father—Scott says, “He's inspired others to attend merit badge academies and challenge themselves.”

Jacob's journey hasn't been easy, but he encourages others to start early and stay persistent.

Each badge has pushed him, shaped him, and helped him discover who he is and who he wants to be.

As he works toward completing all 142, Jacob stands as a reminder of what Scouting makes possible: curiosity, confidence, and a love of lifelong learning.

Honoring the Spirit of Eagle Scouts

Earning the rank of Eagle Scout represents the highest ideals of Scouting—leadership, service, and a commitment to making the world better. Whether through innovative community projects, environmental stewardship, support for public safety, or the personal journey of growth and perseverance that leads to the Eagle badge, these Scouts demonstrate what it means to live with purpose. Their achievements reflect not only the skills they've gained, but the values they carry forward as they prepare for the future.



Eagle Scout Lyla — Finding Her Voice Through Scouting

Lyla didn't join Scouting because she was excited about camping, uniforms, or earning badges. She joined because someone she trusted believed Scouting could help her. At the time, she wasn't sure it would. Earning the rank of Eagle Scout marked a turning point. Through her Eagle Scout service project, Lyla experienced firsthand the impact of service and leadership. Seeing how her planning, effort, and dedication helped others gave deeper meaning to the rank she earned and reinforced the values Scouting had been teaching her all along. Today, Lyla plans to mentor younger Scouts, volunteer as an adult, and carry the Scout Oath and Law into everyday life—living with dependability, respect, and a commitment to service.



Scout Vini — Training Tomorrow's Heroes

At only 13, Vini is demonstrating remarkable leadership through his Eagle project supporting the Polk County Sheriff's Office. He is raising funds for advanced simulation devices that help deputies train for high-stress scenarios by temporarily disabling an arm or leg—teaching officers how to stay effective even when “wounded.” Sheriff Grady Judd praised Vini's initiative, noting the impact this equipment will have on deputy readiness and safety. A member of Troop 528, Vini has been in Scouting since 2021 and is committed to serving his community in meaningful ways. His project carries forward a proud tradition of Scouts aiding local law enforcement and reflects Scouting's mission to prepare youth for a lifetime of leadership.



Eagle Scout Ish R. — Innovating for K-9 Search and Rescue

For his Eagle project, Ishaanth partnered with the Pasco County Sheriff's Office to solve a pressing need: replacing worn, ineffective scent-training boxes used by the K-9 search and rescue team. After more than a year of planning, approvals, and construction, Ish delivered durable, weather-resistant wooden boxes now used to train over 55 working dogs. The project not only supports critical search operations but also demonstrates Ish's ingenuity and perseverance—especially as the administrative hurdles proved harder than the build itself. His work now strengthens one of the most respected K-9 units in Florida and stands as a model of service that leaves a lasting mark on community safety.



Eagle Scout Michael H. — A Lifetime Shaped by Scouting

Michael's Scouting journey began at just three years old, tagging along to his older brother's meetings and dreaming of the day he could join. From Cub Scout to Eagle Scout, his path took him through multiple units, each shaping his confidence and character. At Troop 71, under dedicated leadership, he found his Scouting home—earning his Eagle, mentoring younger Scouts, and continuing to serve long after his board of review. For Michael and his family, Scouting has always been more than badges and ranks—it's a shared legacy of adventure, values, and lifelong community. His story reflects the best of Scouting: growth, perseverance, and a commitment to giving back.

A YEAR OF ADVENTURE AND ADVANCEMENT

12,866 Youth Served in 2025

In 2025, our Council reached 12,866 young people across our communities. Each youth experienced hands-on learning, outdoor adventure, and character development that builds confidence, leadership, and resilience for life.

7,443 Scouts from Diverse Backgrounds

Scouting continues to reflect the communities we serve. In 2025, 7,443 Scouts came from diverse backgrounds, ensuring that Scouting remains accessible, welcoming, and relevant to families across the Tampa Bay region.

3,446 Female Scouts Served

Scouting empowers young women to lead with confidence. In 2025, 3,446 female Scouts participated in programs that emphasize leadership, teamwork, and real-world skills through adventure-based learning.

2,418 Youth Served by ScoutReach

ScoutReach removes financial and logistical barriers so more youth can experience Scouting. In 2025, 2,418 ScoutReach participants gained access to outdoor programs, mentorship, and leadership development they otherwise may not have received.

3,022 First-Time Scouts

Scouting welcomed 3,022 first-time Scouts in 2025. For many families, this marked the beginning of a journey built on belonging, discovery, and meaningful experiences that extend far beyond the first meeting.

254 New Eagle Scouts

Earning the rank of Eagle Scout represents years of dedication, service, and leadership. In 2025, 254 Scouts achieved this milestone, completing impactful service projects and demonstrating the highest ideals of Scouting.

\$1.96M Est. Value of 59,407+ Volunteer Hours

Volunteers are the backbone of Scouting. In 2025, unit volunteers and Eagle Scout projects contributed more than 59,407 hours of service, representing an estimated \$1.96 million in community value and countless moments of mentorship, leadership, and hands-on service benefiting youth and local communities.

\$1.5M Total Popcorn Sold

Scouts raised \$1.5 million through the annual popcorn fundraiser in 2025. These funds directly supported local programs, camps, and activities while teaching Scouts goal-setting, responsibility, and teamwork.

33,200 Pounds of Food Donated

Scouts answered the call to serve their neighbors. In 2025, 33,200 pounds of food were collected and donated to local food pantries, helping families facing food insecurity across our council area.

12,350 Merit Badges Earned

Merit badges connect learning to real-world skills. In 2025, Scouts earned 12,350 merit badges, exploring topics ranging from STEM and trades to health, conservation, and citizenship.

166 Community Partners

Scouting thrives through collaboration. In 2025, 166 community partners supported our programs through shared resources, mentorship, and opportunities that expand learning beyond the Scout meeting.

47 New Units Formed

Growth continues across the council. In 2025, 47 new Scouting units were formed, expanding access to Scouting in neighborhoods, schools, and chartering organizations throughout the Greater Tampa Bay Area.
